Certificate – an applied technology education results in appropriate licensing, certification, or skill training to qualify students for specific employment in business and industry.

Associates of Applied Technology - (AAT): requires at least 2 years of education that allows a student to take a skill directly into the workforce. In an effort to meet the needs of business and industry for a highly skilled workforce, the Utah System of Higher Education has developed associate of applied technology degrees designed to prepare students for direct entry into the workforce. This degree is not transferable to another college or university.

Associates of Science/Art – requires at least 2 years of education beyond high school (or GED). Programs at these schools may include: Liberal Arts, General Studies, Business, Marketing, Education, Health Sciences, etc.

Bachelor's of Science/Art - requires at least 4 years of education beyond high school (or 2 years beyond associate's degree). Each of these institutions has a variety of degrees.

Master's of Science/Art - requires at least 1 to 2 years of education beyond bachelor's degree.

Doctorate or Professional - These degrees require at least 2 to 3 years of education beyond bachelor's degree.
